# end of the line

## background & rules

### BACKGROUND

Nobody is sure when the nightclub called the Line first appeared, or who owns it. The Line is a place where questions are best not asked. The Line is a place that welcomes all nationalities, all cultures, all creatures.

At the Line everyone are equals. Primogen rub shoulders with anarchs. Camarilla share the dancefloor with Sabbat. Grudges and affiliations are left at the door. It has always been this way, and the Management will tolerate nothing less.

The Line is a place to simply be. And everyone wants to be at the Line.

### RULES

The End of the Line is a constructed V:TES Storyline game format designed principally for play at the Grand Masquerade taking place in Berlin on 11th -14th May 2017, but which can be repeated by play groups worldwide.

Except as noted in these instructions, each Storyline game will follow the VEKN Constructed Tournament rules for card play and deck construction.

At least 75% (e.g. 9 out of 12) of the vampires in each player's crypt must be of capacity 4 or less. In addition to the standard list of VEKN banned cards and errata, the following changes to deck construction apply:

- ◆ Gehenna Event cards may not be played.
- ◆ Imbued may not be played.

End of the Line has been designed with single, short-format pickup games in mind.. Each game must adhere to the following additional rules:

- ◆ Each Methuselah begins the game with only 20 pool (rather than the usual 30).
- ◆ Each game is timed to last 1 hour.

A library card representing the Line can be found in the pack of printed VTES cards given to each attendee of the Grand Masquerade.

During each End of the Line Storyline game, a player controlling the Line card may cast 2 additional votes during each referendum.

### WORLDWIDE PLAY & RESULTS

It is suggested that play groups worldwide should run their own End of the Line games on the weekend of 13th & 14th May to coincide with the Grand Masquerade.

Regardless of when you run your event, you are welcome to submit your results to the Storyline Co-ordinator for consideration. These results should include:

- ◆ The names and VEKN IDs of all players.
- ◆ A short description of each deck (and clan) played.
- ◆ A list of the most prominent vampires used in the game
- ◆ A list of the most important locations, equipment and allies used in the game
- ◆ A description of the most unusual or unexpected actions taken during the game
- ◆ The victory point and table win scores of each player
